Trees Fall (Aug. – Oct.) – Conifers, Cycads and Angiosperm Hardwoods begins Thursday, August 21 - October 19, 2014 at 1 - 2 pm Central. Each session is 8 weeks long. It is not necessary to have taken previous classes to join up during any of the 8-week sessions.

This class fosters student-led projects, student and teacher led discussions, activities, and student and teacher presentations centered on studying trees of the world. Student participation includes doing hands-on activities and projects mainly offline about favorite local and worldwide trees, having class discussions, making PowerPoint presentations by students and teacher, and videos.

This is an experiential learning class for upper elementary, middle and high school ages interested. Projects will be based on student choice, level of skill and materials available.

PBBT is a course for students who are curious and desirous to learn about trees and are self-motivated to do independent, quality projects out of a sincere desire to learn the subject. It is a great study to discover the amazing plant kingdom. The whole family is welcome to take the course for one price. The Trees class will use the Adobe Connect CurrClick Live Virtual Classroom. A computer microphone and high-speed Internet connection is necessary.

This course is a Project Based learning model and students are asked to keep both a digital and hard copies of a portfolio and nature journal. There are no grades or tests, but portfolios, journals and binders can be saved and used for parents needing proof of student work for the state.
